

MINISTER'S MESSAGE

The Tension Between Faith and Doubt: Jesus' Resurrection and Ascension



The tension between faith and doubt is a common experience that has existed throughout human history and continues to challenge our understanding of the world and how we are to perceive God in the general scheme of things. That is why Charles Spurgeon once commented, "I do not believe there ever existed a Christian..., who did not now and then doubt his interest in Jesus. I think, when a man says, 'I never doubt,' it is quite time for us to doubt him." C. S Lewis expressed his concerns when he said, "I think the trouble with me is lack of faith... often when I pray, I

wonder if I am not posting letters to a non-existent address." However, the tension between faith and doubt is more revealing in the resurrection and ascension of Jesus.

The resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ are central events of the Christian faith. They are the foundation of our hope and the assurance of our salvation. Through these events, Jesus demonstrated his victory over sin and death and paved the way for the establishment of his kingdom. For Christian people, the resurrection and ascension are sources of joy, peace, and hope, but these events have also been sources of doubt and scepticism. The idea of a man rising from the dead and ascending to heaven seems implausible or even absurd. It challenges our understanding of the natural order and raises difficult questions about the nature of God and the universe. And it can be difficult to reconcile the reality of suffering and evil in the world with the idea of a loving and all-powerful God who would allow such things to happen.

The disciples of Jesus struggled with doubt in the face of his resurrection and ascension. They were witnesses to these events but still struggled to believe that they were real. It was only through the guidance of the Holy Spirit and their own personal encounters with the risen Lord that their doubts were overcome. As Christians, we too struggle with doubts from time to time. That is why Pope Francis has asked the question: "Who among us has not experienced insecurity, loss and even doubts on their journey of faith? ...We've all experienced this, me too". Doubt is a natural part of the human experience and should not be dismissed or ignored. Instead, we should acknowledge our doubts and seek to confront them honestly and openly. We should seek guidance from the Holy Spirit and the support of our Christian community as we seek to deepen our faith and understanding of God and his mighty power among us.

If you are seeking to explore your faith journey and to seek answers to some of your doubts, I invite you to join us at Newport-on-Tay Church for our church services on Sundays, from 11:00am to 12:00pm and in the evening, for a more contemporary service from 6:00pm to 6:45pm. At Newport Church, we understand that the tension between faith and doubt is not a barrier to our relationship with God, but rather a challenge that can strengthen and deepen our faith. It is through this tension that we come to a deeper understanding of who God is and how he works in our lives. As we navigate this tension during this post-Easter time, and look forward to the ascension of Jesus, let us take comfort in the words of Jesus to his doubting disciple Thomas: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (John 20:29).

Church Ceiling Damage

In mid-February, there was a fall of plaster from the ceiling of the church nave, beside the vent nearest the rear of the church. The plaster fell onto the pews causing a little damage. Unfortunately, for safety reasons, morning worship since then has been held in the hall until the ceiling has been made safe.

As the damage coincided with a severe storm, an insurance claim was prepared and submitted. Various contractors have inspected the damage, along with our Presbytery's Buildings Officer and a claims consultant from Aviva insurers. Internal examination identified 3 areas needing attention / repair and at a height of 13 metres will require scaffolding at each location. Repair is also needed on the roof.

Sadly, the insurers have declined liability on this occasion, so we are now progressing with the repair work and with the need for it to be funded wholly from our own reserves. We are currently waiting on a planning schedule from the contractors to repair the damage. In the first instance it will be to make the roof wind and water tight and from there to repair the internal damage.

Unfortunately, in the meantime, morning services will need to continue in the hall until the work has been completed.

It is currently a team of 3 people who do an amazing job in providing a service for those unable to attend church in person to join worship online. Much of the past month has seen us all spend time reflecting on our own personal thoughts about the events of Easter and how that has impacted on us and on our lives today.

Having returned to meet together, the boys undertook an exercise to inform BB Headquarters (BBHQ) with thoughts and opinions from boys to potentially influence the style and content of future programmes. They had to consider quite a number of actual and potential activities and events and they were required to label each into one of four categories - "My Top 5 Activities", "More of These Please", "Maybe Sometimes" or "No Thanks". As with a similar exercise last month about overall types of activities, this information has been passed to BBHQ for incorporation into a national overview of boys' responses.

Our focus then turned to practising and undertaking our entry for the Juniors International Team Games in which a set of six games requiring minimal equipment and preparation are each played by six boys and our results have been submitted to BBHQ for comparison with other entrants from around the globe. Last year we finished 97th out of 136 teams - an excellent performance from our young boys; hopefully, this year (with more boys and last year's players a year older) we will manage an even better placing - but time will tell.

Following this, our thoughts and activities turn to focus on the Coronation of King Charles III, when we can enthuse our boys about this historic occasion and make it even more meaningful to them.

I would like to thank the Kirk Session, my line manager Evelyn Wood, and our Minister Amos, for allowing me to experience the Time and Space Conference. There will be a report published in the next couple of months, that will go more in depth with my experiences on this conference. However I wanted to share a couple of thoughts before then.



I thoroughly enjoyed my time on Iona, where I met so many amazing people who were God-centred and focused on his mission. It was a real challenge living with the Iona Community as an introvert, yet I felt it was a real blessing to be a part of that community even for a short while. A lot of the experience helped me to focus on God and what he was doing in our community here in Newport-on-Tay. There were some things I would do differently, like spend more time in God's Creation and less time worrying about my social anxiety and flaws. There are some things that I want to implement in my relationship with God and my work in our community, like exploring how I can experience true rest on the sabbath day, but to summarise my experience in one paragraph it would be this:



I was speaking to fellow conference delegates and a lot of people got told this when they found out they were going to Iona - "Iona is a thin place where you can meet God easier than anywhere else."

I wholeheartedly disagree with that statement. God is absolutely everywhere you go - you just need to take your time and patiently wait in his presence. If you spend more time truly resting in God's presence, then you will be more attuned to what he is doing; oh, and expect the unexpected!
